

DIRECTIONS AND PARKING

Directions

- From I-95 North or South**
 Take I-95 North or South to Exit 47 (Route 34 West). Visitor parking is available in Air Rights Garage (see map and parking). Enter the Air Rights Garage from North or South Frontage Roads.
- From I-91 South**
 Take I-91 South to Exit 1 (Route 34 West). Visitor parking is available in Air Rights Garage (see map and parking). Enter the Air Rights Garage from North or South Frontage Roads.
- Wilbur Cross Parkway (Route 15) Traveling South**
 Take Exit 59 immediately after tunnel, and then a right at end of ramp. Merge left onto Whalley Avenue at light. Stay on Whalley until you see signs for Yale-New Haven at Park Street. Follow hospital signs, and then make a left turn onto South Frontage Road. Visitor parking is available in Air Rights Garage (see map and parking). Enter the Air Rights Garage from South Frontage Road.
- Merritt Parkway (Route 15) Traveling North**
 Take Exit 57 to Route 34 east into New Haven, and then a right onto Ella T. Grasso Boulevard (Rte. 10) and left onto South Frontage Road (Legion Avenue). Follow hospital and Route 34 signs. Covered entrance at 20 York Street. Visitor parking available in Air Rights Garage.

 Enter from North or South Frontage Roads.
- Route 1 (Boston Post Road) Traveling East**
 After crossing Ella T. Grasso Boulevard (Route 10), turn left onto Davenport Avenue. When Davenport crosses Howard Avenue, it becomes York Street. Visitor parking is available in Air Rights Garage (see map and parking). Enter the Air Rights Garage from York Street
- From Downtown New Haven**
 From the New Haven Green, go south on College Street. Cross the bridge, which overpasses the highway (Route 34 Connector); College Street then merges with Congress Avenue. Bear right, and then take the first right onto Cedar Street. The School of Medicine is half-way down the block on your right.



Parking

Air Rights Garage is open 24 hours a day and located between North and South Frontage Roads, straddling York Street. Hourly, half-day, daily, and monthly rates are available. Call the New Haven Parking Authority at (203) 946-893 for current rate information. Special parking spaces for disabled visitors are located next to the elevators on each parking level. The garage is monitored by Yale-New Haven Hospital Security Services. A covered pedestrian bridge connects the second floor of the garage to the 20 York Street entrance of the Yale-New Haven Hospital.
