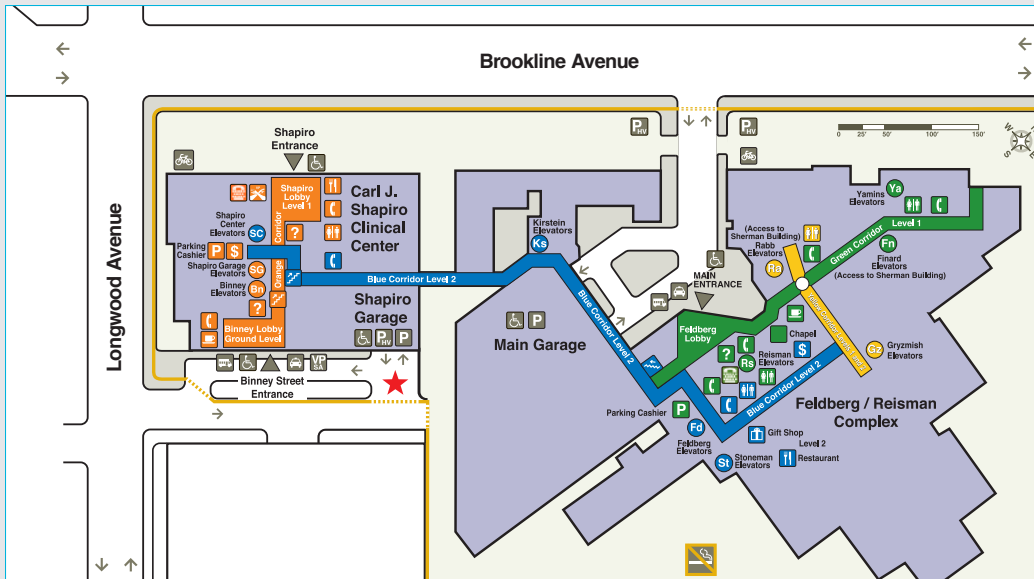
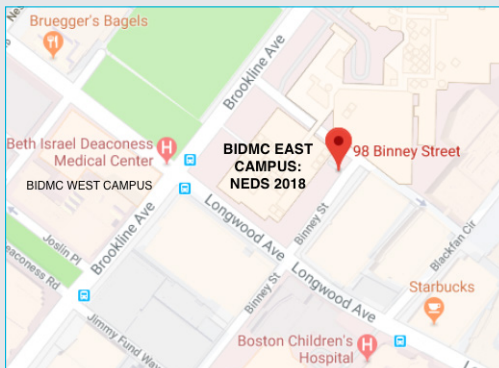


CAMPUS MAPS AND PARKING LOCATIONS



If you will be arriving by car, please park in the underground parking garage underneath the Carl J. Shapiro Center. The entrance to the garage is on the left end of Binney Street (off Longwood Avenue; garage address for GPS is **98 Binney Street**). Please do not park in the Children's Hospital Garage (the first garage on your right as you turn off of Longwood Avenue) as this garage is less convenient and you will have to walk outside to reach the Carl J. Shapiro Center. After parking, you will enter the Carl J. Shapiro Center and make your way to the 2nd floor. A continental breakfast will be provided in the **Leventhal Conference Room** on the second floor prior to the start of our patient viewing.

Once you exit the main Shapiro entrance on the lobby floor, turn right to go across the street to the Inn at Longwood Medical. You will see a large sign for the inn. Enter through the inn and take the elevators to the Galleria Level and walk into Longwood Hall.
